# The Eternal Kingdom "The New Testament Church"

As we continue to look at the NT church, I would like for us to consider "Church in Preparation".

- Church in Preparation
  - What was John the immersing one's role?
  - What was John's attitude towards Christ?
  - What the Old Law make people aware of?
  - What was the purpose of the Old Law?
  - What message did Jesus preach regarding "the Kingdom"?

- The Church in Reality
  - During what major feast was the church established?
  - What guided the apostles into all truth?
  - Where was the birth place of the church?
  - Who was the man and what was the plan the Apostles preached?
  - How does this differ from what is preached today?

- The Basis of Membership
  - "What shall we do?" (Acts 2:37)
  - In unison and in harmony, Jesus prepared His disciples to give an answer (Acts 2:38)
  - Nearly 3,000 responded and did exactly what they were commanded to do (Acts 2:41)
  - The Greek word for baptism means to submerge or immerse
  - There is only one baptism (Eph.4:4)
  - It is a burial and a resurrection (Rom.6:1-4; Col.2:11-12)
  - How does the math support 3,000 baptisms in one day?

## The Basis of Growth from the Book of Acts Chapter Two

- · Questions:
  - By what spirit were the apostles speaking with when they preached on Pentecost?
  - Was their language understandable by all?
  - Who was preached?
  - What was the multitude held accountable for?
  - How were they to be forgiven?
  - If God approved of denominations, why didn't all twelve apostle preach about it?
  - Once converted, what were these souls added unto?
  - What is the basis of membership?

- Rapid Growth
  - 5,000 (Acts 4:4)
  - Multitudes were added (Acts 5:14)
  - The message never changed (5:42)
  - More multitudes were added (Acts 6:7)

(Read slide and all points).

Do we at any point see any deviation from Acts 2?

Why would anyone think those in Acts 5 or 6 would do anything different than what Jesus commanded the souls on Pent experienced? It wasn't different!
